NEW SECTION 101.1 WOULD READ AS FOLLOWS (changes to existing text are shown following the new sections)

### 101.1 STARTS [ Moved from 102.14. STARTER]

. 1 Equipment - A loudspeaker start system conforming to 103.15 , with or without an underwater recall device, and an electronic strobe signal as provided in 105.3 visible to all manual timers and for forward and backstroke starts, shall be the preferred starting device. A .22 caliber pistol may be used.

## . 2 The Start

A At the commencement of each heat - - - undue delay to the starting position (101.3 4.1).
B When the swimmers and officials are ready -- are under the Starter's control.
C On the Starters command "Take your mark" - - the Starter shall give the starting signal.
D When a swimmer does not respond promptly - - the swimmers may stand up or step off the blocks.

## . 3 False Starts

A Any swimmer starting before the signal is given - - restart the race upon signal by the Referee.
B If the starting signal has been given before the disqualification is -- upon completion of the race.
C If the recall signal is activated inadvertently, - - upon signal by the Referee.

## . 5 Deliberate Delay or Misconduct

Purpose: $\quad$ The proposed language for 101.5.2 would work for both the four-stroke Individual Medley as well as the three-stroke 150 yard/meter Individual Medley for certain functional classes of swimmers with a disability. The term "designated portion" is defined as one-fourth in the initial portion of Rule 101.5. For the 150 yard/meter Individual Medley, the designated portion is onethird, as defined in the proposed change for Rule 104.2.2B. Use of the term "prescribed distance" is consistent with wording in the initial portion of Rule 101.5.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection as the proposed change is unnecessary. The 150 yard/meter Individual Medley was moved from 104.2.2B to the Policy Manual last year (as reflected in this year's HK-4). It is an event prescribed by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) for its competitions and need not be included in our rulebook.
101.5 Individual Medley - The swimmer shall swim the prescribed distance in the following order: the first one-fourth, butterfly; the second one-fourth, backstroke; the third one-fourth, breaststroke; and the last onefourth, freestyle.

## . 1 Start - Unchanged

. 2 Stroke - The stroke for each designated portion ene fourth-of the prescribed designated distance shall follow the prescribed rules for that stroke.
. 3 \& . 4 Unchanged

Proposed by: Michael Lawrence, Illinois Swimming
Purpose: To add the $4 \times 100$ relays to the recognized events for $10 \&$ under swimmers. In LSCs with limited facilities due to water depth rules, 10 \& under relay events must be conducted using inwater starts. This (potentially) further limits the available facilities as many coaches/parents/swimmers want the opportunity to achieve rankings and records. Since the 100 free is already a recognized event, it seems logical that the $4 \times 100$ relays are also a recognized event.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection. LSCs may include the $4 \times 100$ relays as "other events" pursuant to the first sentence of 102.1.2. If the $4 \times 100$ were specifically listed under the 10 \& under age group, it might be considered mandatory contrary to previous recommendations of the Age Group Committee.

. 6 The composition of a relay team may be changed between preliminaries and finals., except that All members competing on a relay team disqualified during preliminaries shall be barred from further competition in that event.
. 7 First and last names of eligible relay swimmers, their ages, and order of swimming shall be submitted on a Relay Entry form to the clerk of the course (if used) or to the head lane timer. Any changes in names of the competing swimmers or their order of swimming must be declared to the Head Lane Timer prior to the start of the heat in which such relay team is entered. No changes will be permitted thereafter.

Purpose: The existing language could be misconstrued to mean that the time achieved in the swim-off is not an official time, which would be a contradiction of $102.16 .4 \mathrm{~A}(1)(\mathrm{b})$. The time achieved in the swim-off is an official time, but it is not used in the seeding of finals. Additional change reflects that swim-offs are needed to resolve ties for eligibility for competing in $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}$, and C finals and for alternates.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection as it is unnecessary to specifically designate the number of consolation finals. As defined in the Glossary, there may be any number of "consolation" finals and the current rule is more flexible.

Purpose: $\quad$ Rule 102.7.3 includes provision for scoring in pools configured for 4 lanes through 10 lanes, but Rule 102.5.3 covers pools configured for 5 through 10 lanes. The proposed change to Rule 102.5.3 would make provision for a 4-lane pool.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection as unnecessary. The current rule and table is sufficiently clear that the seeding of any number of lanes (less than 5 or more than 10) can be extrapolated from the example.

### 102.5 LANE ASSIGNMENTS - SEEDING - COUNTERS - ORDER OF HEATS

.3 Finals - In finals, the times to be considered are those times made in preliminary heats. If any qualifying swimmers have the same time their respective lanes shall be determined by draw. Lane assignments shall be made in descending order of qualifying times by placing the fastest swimmer or team in the center lane in a pool with an odd number of lanes, or in lanes $\underline{2}, 3,4$, or 5 respectively in pools having $4,6,8$, or 10 lanes. The swimmer having the next fastest time is to be placed in the lane to the left, then alternating the remaining swimmer(s) to the right and left in accordance with the submitted times. (see chart below)

Purpose: Clarify the rule to cover the situation in which bonus finals are swum. Also, clarify that alternates do receive placing (and points, as appropriate) only if they swim in the heat.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection as unnecessary. As previously stated, there may be any number of "consolation" finals and the current rule is more flexible.

### 102.7 SCORING

. 6 Disqualifications - When a relay team or individual swimmer is disqualified, the subsequent places will move up accordingly and points shall be awarded to conform with the new places. Consolation finalists shall not receive championship final placing. Bonus finalists shall not receive consolation final placing. Alternates shall not receive championship, consolation, or bonus final placing unless they actually compete in that heat.

Proposed by: George Homewood on behalf of Virginia Swimming
Purpose: Failure to give honest effort demonstrates a lack of respect for fellow athletes and meet personnel and belittles the competitors in the particular event. As proposed, this would merely impose a standard upon swimmers that should already be the very hallmark of sportsmanship. One of the concerns expressed in previous years' discussions is that it is subjective. This is certainly true, but this is no more subjective a standard than the "unsportsmanlike or unsafe manner" currently a part of 102.10.3 or the "interfering with the competition" of 102.10.8 or for that matter the whole "noncontinuous turning action" of the backstroke turn. Another argument made is that the authority to deem this behavior as unsportsmanlike behavior already is implicit in the rule. Perhaps it is and perhaps it isn't, but to the extent that it is implied, it is subject to far more interpretation and inequitable application for not being explicitly stated and thus this should be viewed as a clarification of an item already implied. By placing this in the Rules and Regulations, we serve notice that competitors are expected to compete. No penalty is mandated, just as none is mandated for any other act covered by the rule.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection, as it did in 2004 and 2005, on the basis that this legislation is unnecessary. Under existing rules, any swimmer not making an honest effort can, at the Referee's discretion, be disqualified for delay of the meet or unsportsmanlike conduct.

.3 Any swimmer who acts in an unsportsmanlike, including a failure to make an honest effort to compete, or unsafe manner within the swimming venue may be considered for appropriate action or penalty by the referee.

Purpose: To require that a meet jury be appointed prior to competition. Appointing a jury prior to competition eases potential concerns/charges of bias or conflict when a meet jury is named after a protest is filed.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection. A meet jury is seldom needed in local competition and the change in wording might imply that a jury could not be appointed after the start of a meet.

### 102.11 PROTESTS

. 2 For consideration of all other protests lodged at the meet, the Referee may shall appoint a meet jury prior to the start of competition. The jury shall consist of not fewer than three (3) and not more than five (5) persons, at least one of whom shall be a coach and one an athlete.

Proposed by: Don Riedlinger, Senior Division Chair, Potomac Valley
Purpose: USA-S should specify as a requirement the minimum number of officials to conduct a meet. The current wording of the rule uses "should" rather than "shall" which makes the rule more a recommendation rather than an absolute requirement. This proposal also changes the minimum number of required timers to be consistent with 102.16.4C.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection since it would allow even high caliber local meets to be run without an adequate number of officials.

### 102.12 Officials

. 3 For all swimming meets or time trials except dual meets there should shall not be fewer than the following officiating positions filled or approved by the LSC in authority. Officials other than the Referee may act in more than one officiating capacity only when sufficient qualified officials are not available, but no one may simultaneously time and judge the order of finish.

Purpose: Present wording regarding notification of a false start disqualification "upon completion of the race" could be interpreted to mean that if a swimmer is not notified immediately after the race, the disqualification is nullified. Rule 102.10.2 is standard protocol for notification of other infractions and 102.14.5B should be standardized using this process.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection in favor of retaining the current FINA language.

### 102.14.5 False Starts

A. If the starting signal has been given before the disqualification is declared, the race shall continue without recall. If the Referee independently observes and confirms the starter's observation that a violation occurred, the swimmer or swimmers who have false started shall be notified of the disqualification upen completion of the race in accordance with 102.10.2.

Purpose: The no-recall false start rule was in part put in place because it is thought that an athlete's first start is generally their best start, and that to recall a race therefore penalizes those athletes that

did not false start. By rule, if the Starter inadvertently recalls the heat, there is no false start charged. However, the situation in which the starter recalls a start because they believe there is a false start and that false start negatively impacted the legal start of one or more other members of that heat, there is no guidance in the Rules and Regulations. Indeed, the only discussion of recalls suggests that no false start should be charged even if the Referee would have otherwise confirmed the false start. In querying senior starters and referees, different responses have been provided. Some suggest that all recalls must result in simply resetting the field for a restart of the entire heat; others focus on the word "inadvertently" in 102.14.5.C to respond that a purposeful recall can certainly result in a false start being assessed. As a consequence, a swimmer starting before the starting signal has been given may be afforded a "second chance" to swim when their infraction was in fact so egregious as to have affected other swimmers in the heat. The proposed change would remove this second chance if the Referee independently confirms the Starter's observation, while still allowing for the norm to be that we do not recall for false starts. The NFHS this year has adopted the no recall starting protocols and have embodied this principle into its Rulebook.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends rejection so as to be as consistent as possible with FINA rules.

### 102.14.5 FALSE STARTS

D (new) If the recall signal is activated in response to a false start that in the judgment of the starter negatively impacted the legal start of one or more other swimmers in the heat and the Referee independently observes and confirms the starter's observation that a violation occurred, the swimmer or swimmers who have false started shall be disqualified. The Starter shall then restart the race upon signal by the Referee with the remaining swimmers.

Purpose: The term "National Reportable Times" or NRT was originally created to describe the times meeting a "AA" or better time standard which were the only ones to be included in SWIMS in the early days of the program. When this was changed to include all official times regardless of standard, the term was applied to those times meeting the qualifying standard for Top 16 times. The term 'NRT' is not well understood and occasions many questions from SWIMS users. The substitution of the term "Top 16 Reportable Times (T16R)" would be clearer and better describe the time involved.

Recommendation: The Rules \& Regulations Committee recommends approval.

replicate. The atmosphere and excitement and drive to success at the Junior National meets have also not been replicated at the sectional meets. And because USA Swimming has not provided the opportunities that the Junior National meets did, other groups and organizations have filled the void. The success of these alternative meets alone speaks clearly to the desirability of having and the demand by coaches and athletes for the opportunities offered. As an organization, we have five years of experience with the sectional meet system and it is apparent that the system is broken and demands fixing. The proposed change would create a new Junior National Series in the spring with one meet in each zone and consistent course length and time standards for each meet. The decisions for course length and time standards would be left to Program Operations and Senior Swimming and could change from year to year if the needs of competitive progression warranted such changes. The proposal is limited to the spring because the organization has only one year of experience with the current summer program, but it appeared to work in 2005. The rationale for proposing one meet per zone is to exploit some of the sectional organizational capabilities that have developed since 2001 as well as to afford opportunities perhaps for bonus events, expanded time trials, or other similar options that can benefit the athletes. While this is a proposal in which we believe and would like to see adopted and implemented, we offer it also as the starting point for what we believe needs to be a serious national discussion on whether the sectional meets are meeting the competitive needs of our athletes and clubs. To this end, we ask that in some manner at the 2006 Convention and House of Delegates meeting that the House be given an opportunity to vote, even if only in a nonbinding way that provides guidance to the USA Swimming Board regarding the efficacy and desirability of maintaining the sectional meet framework as it currently exists during at least the spring.

If that LSC subsequently changes the number of Board Members, it will have to recalculate the number of Athlete Representatives accordingly.
