Responsibilities

- In many ways MR is the Captain of a ship
- Leader that organizes this team to run a safe, fair and fun competition IAW the sanction.
- Head Official to ensure meet is run IAW the sanctioned Meet Invite
- Ensure safety of all athletes, coaches, volunteers and parents

Before the Meet

- Work with Meet Director for planning
- Review Meet Announcement –

– Accuracy and completeness

- Review entries and timelines — Compliance with 4-hour rule for 12 &U
- Develops/offers contingency plans for any issue identified
- Works with named officials chair

Before the Meet (cont)

- Championship Meet
 - Select AR & LCJ
- Leadership Team and notes how you want things handled
 - Invigilating and DR/SR rotation
- Maybe meet before to discuss any situations and how they will be handled.

Before the Meet (cont)

- Works with MD for volunteers
- Meet Marshall cards and info
- Paper and equipment needs
- Who are contacts at pool email and introduce yourself
- Schedule a meeting to go over safety checklist/site visit

Site Visit and Prior to Meet

- Have you worked at this pool?
- Emergency action plan Thunderstorms etc
- Pool Chemistry, water and air temp
- How many Marshalls do they require?
- Slippery areas on deck?
- Blocks sturdy?
- Diving boards roped off?
- First aid and injuries

Coaches Meeting

- Introduction of key officials
- Facility layout, timelines, warm-up safety procedures, heat sheets, relay cards, scratches, time trials, parading, finals, etc
- Who and where to go to
- Always before each meet, especially if teams are visiting.
- Announce the Meet Jury

Meet Jury

- Mechanism with the rules that resolves any protests
- Protests against the judgement decisions of starters, stroke, turn, place and relay judges can only be considered by the Referee and Referee's decision is final.

During the Meet

- MR should be visible but not obtrusive — Stay in your lane
- Guidance to DR and LCJs for equitable deck coverage
- Safe and fair competition
- Periodically sample the atmosphere
- Be careful about setting an early precedent
- Check in with your team
- Conduct a self-eval

Obstacles Along the Way

• Weather

- Get with Pool Mgr and MD
- Select potential events that can be scratched
 Warm up time needed when you resume
- Gather info run it by a couple of coaches you trust
- Hold a coaches meeting

Obstacles Along the Way

- Weather at Championship Meets
 - Same as above
 - Circle seed versus timed finals
 - Score meet as timed finals if finals will be canx
 - Other things consider is money, travel, host team losses.

Adjudicating Calls

- First CJ and DR, then MR
- Talk to CJ and DR separately
 - What is your understanding of the call
 - Did they hear any doubt in explanation
- Talk to S&T
 - Have them explain the three standard questions
 - Did you hear any doubt?

Things that Come Up

- Disabilities
- Deck Changing
- Jolyn Swimsuits Tie back
- Two suits address after the swim
- No show vs delay of meet
- Swimoff's
- Initial splits

- Kinesio tape with a DR note
- Compression bands supporting joints
- Coach challenging a call
- Recalls
- Alternates
- Backstroke Ledges
- Injuries

Reports

- Keep notes on start and finish times
- Which Officials stood out?
- Any issues or concerns about other Officials?
- Who finished training?
- Any issues with Meet Invite or timelines?
- Air quality, facility, hosting, or injuries?
- Keeps district chairs in the loop
- Submit any report of occurrence IMMEDIATELY

OTS and CJs

- Add them as Meet Administrators in OTS
- Allow them to enter sessions and activities
- Good practice for DR training
- Meet Report and OTS Sessions
